

### New Safety Buoys


- Based upon member feedback, the BLAA has purchased 4 blaze orange buoys, which are located on the perimeter of the large bar on the southern side of the lake.
- These buoys are more visible than the small markers used in the past, especially during windy conditions.
- The existing markers have been repositioned to improve visibility.
- If these buoys work well, the BLAA may purchase more for the 2022 season.
- Thanks to Vice President Tom Calder for leading this effort to make Boulder Lake safer for boaters.

## Fishery Improvement Workgroup Update

- After BLAA's 2020 Annual Meeting we formed an informal workgroup which has discussed and researched how to improve Boulder Lake's fishery. Here is what the workgroup has done.
  - Researched the DNR Fish Sticks program and the use of cribs
  - Held discussions with various DNR resources and private consultants
- After reviewing the research and assessing the data about Boulder Lake's fishery, the Board believes the best path forward for the next couple of years is to continue to work on the recommendations from the 2018 Healthy Lake Program. Here are a few reasons.
  - The most recent DNR fish studies show Boulder Lake's fishery is excellent with good reproduction.
  - The next step in moving forward with collecting additional information is to hire a consultant for ~\$10,000 to conduct a thorough lake study.
  - Cribs collect fish <u>and</u> fishers so they are not effective in improving the fishery.
  - Fish Sticks helps improve and sustain the fishery by providing additional habitat and cover for young fish, but in order for a program to be impactful it would likely take 15 to 25 Fish Sticks (clumps of trees secured with cables and anchors to the shoreline) to be installed in the lake. The cost of this project would likely exceed BLAA's current Treasury leaving no funds for emergencies.
- There are many things we can do if we follow the recommendations from the Healthy Lake Report.
- We will review those recommendations during the Annual Meeting.



### BLAA GOES 501(C)(3)!

- It took a while (applied on November 15, 2020), but the IRS has determined BLAA is a 501(c)(3) organization.
- This means all donations and contributions to BLAA are deductible to the full extent of the law.
- Is it important? You bet it is. It is essential for getting private grants, large donations, and bequests.
- The Board will begin discussing next steps.

### Dear Applicant:

We're pleased to tell you we determined you're exempt from federal income tax under Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 501(c)(3). 
### Bait and Tackle

- Leadership Succession Planning
  - Organizations perform best when there is a blend of new and seasoned leaders.
  - The BLAA Board is working hard on recruiting new leaders to ensure it stays strong and vibrant well into the future.
  - There will likely be significant movement over the next two or three years.
  - If you are interested in a BLAA leadership role, please contact Bill Niemuth.
- Fundraising Committee
  - The BLAA Board has spoken about creating a Fundraising Committee.
  - It is exploratory at this point but is especially important now with 501(c)(3) status.
  - One question that will arise is, "What will BLAA do with the funds?" A legitimate question.
  - One thing all organizations need is a rainy-day fund for when the unexpected occurs.
  - Additional funds provide the BLAA the ability to take on projects that were never possible in the past.
  - Stay tuned for more news in this area.
- Potential Boulder Lake Park Picnic Table Upgrade
  - The picnic tables at Boulder Lake Park (area above the boat landing on Airport Road) have deteriorated and are not safe.
  - Director Dennis Reuss has researched the land use and it is possible for BLAA to upgrade these tables for our and others' use.
  - The BLAA Board is researching options and costs and may have a recommendation in the near future.
  - It may also be possible to share costs with others and/or fund through memorials.
  - This is one of the most picturesque places in Boulder Junction and is under-used. Improving these grounds seems to be in BLAA's best interest.

## 2021/2022 BLAA Priorities



Over the past two years, the BLAA has made significant progress in modernizing the organization to ensure its future. Major accomplishments include:

- Completing a Healthy Lake Report based upon a 2018 DNR study.
- Moving to online membership sign-up, payment and donations, including newsletter distribution.
- Attained IRS 501(c)(3) status.
- Installed a new aquatic invasive species sign at Boulder Lake's Boat Landing.
- Updated BLAA's By-Laws.
- Developed a Fishery Improvement Workgroup to research options.
